# Second Semester Examination Policies & Procedures A Survival Guide for Students

### Things to know about semester examinations

- 1. Your semester examinations will be comprehensive. (Comprehensive = covers entire semester.)
- 2. The examination periods are 1.5 hours long.

## What happens on examination days

- 1. No examinations will be given early.
- 2. You may take only one examination per examination period.
- 3. You will stay in the examination classroom for the entire examination period.
- 4. You will not be allowed to go to vending machines or lockers during examination periods.
- 5. If you have to be at school (because of transportation) but do not have an examination to take during one of the testing periods, go to the Blue Room. Bring something to read or study.
- 6. If you come for only the second testing period, enter the building through the <u>front</u> door and go to the Blue Room until 9:20. Don't go to your locker first.

- 7. If you'll be leaving after the first examination period, clear out of the building by 9:30.
- 8. There will be no Afternoon School and no Ride Waiting on examination days.

## Which examinations are given when?

- 1. There are three days of examinations (Monday-Wednesday, May 18–20). There are three examination slots on Wednesday and two each on the remaining two days (seven total examination periods).
- 2. You do not have to be at school when you do not have an examination to take.
- 3. In general, we follow this schedule:
  - First day—first, second and third period classes
  - Second day—fourth and fifth period classes
  - Third day— sixth and seventh period classes
- 4. If you have an open examination period and *if the teacher agrees*, you may arrange to take an examination early during the vacant period. Sometimes a teacher believes that a student will do better if he can take the examination later. Rearranging the order of tests must be worked out between teacher and student. Do **not** assume that you can rearrange your examination schedule without talking to all teachers who are affected.

## **Other responsibilities**

- 1. You will follow the uniform dress code throughout the week.
- 2. If you do not follow the dress code, you will not be allowed to take your examination. You will have to come back to school in the afternoon (properly dressed) to take your examination.
- 3. You will have to take care of all obligations before you'll be allowed to take your examinations—turn in library books, uniforms, textbooks, workbooks, etc. and pay any fines or fees. You will turn in your iPad, case, charger, and cable before you take your last examination.
- 4. If you miss an examination because of an excused absence, you will have several opportunities to make up the examination:
  - If you have a regular examination slot that is empty, you can try to put the missed examination there.
  - You may take it in the afternoons of the examination days (May 18, 19, 20)—Monday (1:30-3:00) and Tuesday or Wednesday (11:30-2:30).
  - You may take it on Thursday morning, May 21, (8:00-12:00).

Everyone who misses an examination because of an excused absence is expected to make it up at one of these times. Exceptions must be cleared by Mrs. Semore or Mrs. Copeland.

# **Exemptions**

Teachers are not required to allow exemptions from semester examinations. Some teachers do; some don't. Your teachers have probably already told you their policies.

If they do allow exemptions, the following rules apply:

- The minimum academic qualification for those exemptions is a solid A– average or better (90% or higher) for the semester.
- A student who has an unexcused absence from a class or three or more unexcused tardies in a class in a semester is ineligible for exemption in that class.
- A student who has violated the Honor Code or who has been suspended for any reason will not be exempted from any semester exams.
